Re: Official Information Act (OIA) Request – Queen Victoria's Royal Charter Letters/Patent follow up enquiry

Thank you for your reply to our response to your OIA request of 22 March 2024. In your reply of 10 April you acknowledged repeatedly submitting the same question to Te Papa and advised that you 'cannot believe, Te Papa does not have a copy of Queen Victoria's Royal Charter/Letters Patent dated 16 November 1840'.

As advised, Archives New Zealand is the organisation that holds this document and has made it available online, so a copy is readily available to the general public.

You have also submitted a further OIA request in which you asked:

How does Te Papa inform the many thousands of visitors who visit Te Papa each year on how New Zealand separated from the dependency of New South Wales and became a British Colony with a Governor and Constitution that set up New Zealand's political, legal and justice systems under one flag and one law, irrespective of race colour or creed?

We have also responded to this enquiry from you previously and it is apparent that you are not satisfied with any response Te Papa has provided. On that basis your repeated submission of the same questions under the OIA can be categorised as vexatious and your request is refused in accordance with s18(h) of the Act.
